- Grey Box - Forest Red Gum grassy woodland trees and scrub extended into site.
- Detention basins shaped to appear naturally occurring. Refer to Mott MacDonald's civil drawings sheet 0257.
- Clumps of Silky Oak to be planted to form pockets of open space, frame views to the landscape beyond and screen houses.
- Existing driveway to be repurposed as a fire trail.
- Use of shrubs to screen houses and focus views beyond the site towards Fernhill House.
- Rural post and rail rough cut timber fence reinforces rural character of the site whilst screening houses.
- Retention of as many trees as possible to maintain the existing rural character of the site.
- Gate provides pedestrain access from Mulgoa Village.
